

Kenneth Harrell Grenewald

SAN FRANCISCO — Kenneth Harrell Grenewald, 53, a former Amarillo resident, died Tuesday, July 11, 1995.

Private memorial services will be at a later date.

Grenewald was a 1959 graduate of Amarillo High School, where he was captain of the football team, a starting center on the basketball team and a south-

paw pitcher who led the '58 and '59 Sandies baseball teams to the state playoffs. He was the inaugural recipient of the Panhandle Sports Hall of Fame baseball player of the year award in 1959.

He attended the University of Texas on a baseball scholarship and then earned a master's degree in history at New York University in New York City. He had been president of Wil-Pro Sports, had owned a hang glider franchise on the West Coast and was involved in commercial fishing in Alaska. He also traveled extensively.

He married Pattie Eakin in 1987.

Survivors include his wife; his mother, Minnie Grenewald of Amarillo; and a brother, William Grenewald of Chicago.
