As a father, I witnessed Burt teach his team several salient lessons by setting important examples for us all. He was, above all, kind and gentle.

He had a kind and encouraging word for each boy on the team. At games and practices he was enthusiastic and was also careful to share with each boy how much the youth had improved, emphasizing each one's strengths.

He taught each boy not to focus on his failures, but rather on improving.

Winning certainly wasn't everything to Burt. He taught the boys that they wouldn't always win, but that they should learn to play their best within the rules.

Burt's death also reminded me that death doesn't know how to distinguish those that are good from those that are bad. Death often takes those who devote their lives to the good of others and leaves the villains to continue to exploit others.

But let us learn that the bottom line is not the numbers on the scoreboard, but the gentleness, compassion and the positive way we encourage each other to do his best, ...as Burt did.
