

# Civic leader Kenneth Wagner dies at age 51

Kenneth Langdon "Kenny" Wagner, 51, of Amarillo, died Monday.

Graveside services will be at 11 a.m. today at Romero Cemetery on the L I T Ranch with the Rev. George H. Quarterman, retired Episcopal bishop of the Northwest Texas Diocese, and the Rev. Jim Tucker, retired Episcopal priest from Houston, officiating. Arrangements are by Boxwell Brothers Funeral Directors.

Mr. Wagner was born in Guymon, Okla., and lived in Amarillo most of his life. He attended public schools in Amarillo, Culver Military Academy, St. Stephen's Episcopal School and the University of Texas at Austin. He

was a director of Tascosa National Bank and was instrumental in construction of the bank's new building on West Interstate 40.

He was a member of St. Andrew's Episcopal Church, was past president of St. Andrew's Day School and served on the board.

Survivors include a son, Shelby Kritser Wagner of Dallas; a daughter, Kelly Katherine Wagner of Denver, a sister, Mrs. Glen Brosier of Amarillo; two brothers, Theodore Joy Wagner

III of Santa Fe., N.M., and Thomas Dehon Wagner of Nashville; and his grandmother, Mrs. Joy Wagner Sr. of Amarillo.
